




MacArthur Memorial




Visitor Guide

Welcome to the MacArthur Memorial, an institution that memorializes General of the Army Douglas MacArthur and pays tribute to the millions of Americans who served the nation during the Civil War, World War I, World War II, the occupation of Japan, and the Korean War. Your visit will inspire you and renew your faith in America's values of *Duty - Honor - Country.*

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Public restrooms are located in the Visitors Center and the Memorial.
- For your convenience, an elevator to the second floor is located in the main lobby of the Memorial.
- Wheelchair assistance is available.
- Translation summaries in French, German, Japanese, Korean, Hebrew, and Spanish are available at the information desk.

MacARTHUR SQUARE

The Memorial and Visitors Center are open daily Tuesday - Saturday 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Sunday 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. We recommend the following self-guided tour sequence.

★ VISITORS CENTER

Begin your tour with a 25-minute film on the life and times of General MacArthur. The Visitors Center also contains a special exhibit gallery, gift shop, visitors lounge, and curatorial facilities. On exhibit are General MacArthur's staff car and a World War II Jeep and motorcycle.

★ MEMORIAL

You begin your self-guided tour in the Rotunda. There are nine permanent galleries beginning from the left of the Rotunda in a clockwise tour of the first and second floors. Museum staff are available to answer your questions.

★ JEAN MacARTHUR RESEARCH CENTER

This building houses the administrative offices, archives/library, and educational facilities. Not a part of the public tour, these facilities are open Monday - Friday, 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Researchers may call to schedule time in the archives.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

The Memorial offers a variety of tours, educational programs and outreach programs for all ages. Podcasts and other resources are also available on our website.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Volunteers are a very important part of the museum. They serve as docents and assist the curator and archivist. If you are interested in volunteering, contact our Education Department at (757) 441-2965.



FIRST FLOOR MEMORIAL

The Rotunda is the focal point of the first floor, which consists of Galleries One and Seven through Nine. Central to the Rotunda are the tombs of General and Mrs. MacArthur. The Rotunda walls display battle flags, excerpts of his speeches, and a resume of his military career. Gallery One, located directly to the left of the Rotunda, highlights MacArthur's Scottish background, family, and early life and career. After visiting Galleries Two through Six upstairs, you will continue your tour on the first floor with Gallery Seven, the Korean War. Galleries Eight and Nine follow MacArthur's post-military life, both private and public, and pay tribute to his legacy.



SECOND FLOOR MEMORIAL

The story of General MacArthur continues as you visit the second floor of the Memorial, which includes Galleries Two through Six. A life-sized trench diorama, interactive maps, artifacts and, artwork guide you through these galleries that cover World Wars I and II, the Occupation of Japan, and the beginnings of the Cold War.
